Inflation trends in the regions

January 2022

Annual inflation in January 2022 was 8.5% (in December 2021– 8.4%). Prices for food increased by 9.9% (in December -9.9%), for non-food - by 8.5% (in December -8.5%), for paid services - by 6.8% (in December -6.5%).

By regions annual inflation accelerated in 10 regions, slowed down in 5 regions, and remained unchanged in 2 regions. The greatest acceleration was recorded in Aktobe region (from 8.7% in December to 9.2% in January), and greatest slowdown was noted in Mangystau region (from 9.2% to 8.7%) and Nur-Sultan city (from 8.8% to 8.3%). Annual inflation was higher than the national level in 8 regions, among which the highest value was recorded in Akmola and Aktobe regions (9.3% and 9.2%, respectively).

Prices for food products in Kazakhstan rose above the national level (9.9%) in Akmola (11.7%), Mangystau (11.6%), Aktobe (11.0%), North Kazakhstan (10.2%) regions, Almaty and Shymkent cities (10.1% for each), as well as Turkestan region (10.0%).

Prices for non-food products are higher than in the country (8.5%) increased in Akmola and Aktobe (10.2% for each), Karaganda (9.7%), Atyrau (9.3%), Pavlodar and East Kazakhstan (8.9% for each) regions.

Prices for paid services in the country increased by 6.8%, while the growth was higher than the national level in West Kazakhstan and East Kazakhstan regions (8.2% each), Shymkent (7.5%), Almaty (7.4%) and Nur-Sultan (7.1%) cities, as well as Atyrau (7.0%) and Karaganda (6.9%) regions.

In January 2022 monthly inflation in the country was 0.7%, which is higher than the average January inflation over the past 5 years (for 2017-2021). Prices in January 2022 rose above their historical average in Almaty city (1.0%), Aktobe (0.9%), Karaganda (0.9%) regions, Shymkent city (0.9%), Akmola (0.8%), West Kazakhstan (0.7%) and North Kazakhstan (0.6%) regions. The rates of price growth in Mangystau, Atyrau, Pavlodar and Kostanay regions grew at their average historical level. In other regions monthly price growth rates have developed below their historical average. The greatest slowdown in the growth rate of monthly inflation was noted in Nur-Sultan city (to 0.4%).
